## From your priest...

Dear friends,

Welcome to the last Sunday of the old year! Next week, on Advent Sunday, we begin once again the journey through the liturgical calendar: we begin with Advent, Christmas and Epiphany, and then a little later come to Lent, Easter and Pentecost. Like every new year, it's a chance to look back and also to look forward: there is much about 2021 that remains uncertain, but we can certainly hope and pray that it will be less disrupted than the past year!

We may not yet be able to see an end point to the challenges and changes of COVID-19, but we can still mark and celebrate significant way-points, milestones in this journey that we are sharing together. And next week, the new year coincides with a significant way-point as we return to our normal pattern of Sunday morning service times. It's an important day in the life of the parish, and I do ask and encourage you to make a point of coming to a service—provided that you feel it is safe given your own circumstances and risk factors.

Those who have come to services in recent weeks will know that this is not church as we have known it! Chairs will be set out with appropriate spacing, and everyone needs to wear a mask. Unfortunately there can't be singing, or morning tea. And we must all keep learning and practising the discipline of keeping a 1.5 metre distance from each other, however much we may want to embrace those we haven't seen for all these months!

Next Sunday, there will be two services at each centre: 7:45am and 10:30am at St Eanswythe's, and 8:45am and 5:30pm at St Clement's. Note the evening service at St Clement's, for next week only: since space is a little tighter there, this is to ensure that no one need miss out on sharing this important day, as we mark a way-point, a fresh start, and a new year.

It's really important that you register in advance, online or by phone or email. The "attending a service" page of our website has the links to register for each service, and shows how many places are left. If your preferred service is filling up, you may be able to consider coming at another time.

And if you can't come, for whatever reason, please do join us via live stream: one service will continue to be streamed each Sunday.

Above all, please pray for our life together as we prepare for this long-awaited moment, as we once again begin to gather in person as the family of the church, the body of Christ.

#### COLLECT

#### PARISH PRAYER

Creator Spirit, God beyond our knowing, your love has been poured into our hearts. Renew our trust in you, and shape our lives to the call of Jesus, our crucified and risen Lord. Make us a people of blessing and hope, so that neighbours and strangers may be drawn to the compassion of Christ. Amen.

FIRST READING Ezekiel 34.11-16

The LORD God proclaims: I myself will search for my flock and seek them out. As a shepherd seeks out the flock when some in the flock have been scattered, so will I seek out my flock. I will rescue them from all the places where they were scattered during the time of clouds and thick darkness. I will gather and lead them out from the countries and peoples, and I will bring them to their own fertile land. I will feed them on Israel's highlands, along the riverbeds, and in all the inhabited places. I will feed them in good pasture, and their sheepfold will be there, on Israel's lofty highlands. On Israel's highlands, they will lie down in a secure fold and feed on green pastures. I myself will feed my flock and make them lie down. This is what the LORD God says. I will seek out the lost, bring back the strays, bind up the wounded, and strengthen the weak. But the fat and the strong I will destroy, because I will tend my sheep with justice.

SECOND READING Ephesians 1.15-23

Since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all God's people, this is the reason that I don't stop giving thanks to God for you when I remember you in my prayers. I pray that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, will give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation that makes God known to you. I pray that the eyes of your heart will have enough light to see what is the hope of God's call, what is the richness of God's glorious inheritance among believers, and what is the overwhelming greatness of God's power that is working among us believers. This power is conferred by the energy of God's powerful strength. God's power was at work in Christ when God raised him from the dead and sat him at God's right side in the heavens, far above every ruler and authority and power and angelic power, any power that might be named not only now but in the future. God put everything under Christ's feet and made him head of everything in the church, which is his body. His body, the church, is the fullness of Christ, who fills everything in every way.

GOSPEL READING Matthew 25.31.46

Jesus said: "Now when the Human One comes in his majesty and all his angels are with him, he will sit on his majestic throne. All the nations will be gathered in front of him. He will separate them from each other, just as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on his right side. But the goats he will put on his left.

"Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who will receive good things from my Father. Inherit the kingdom that was prepared for you before the world began. I was hungry and you gave me food to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger and you welcomed me. I was naked and you gave me clothes to wear. I was sick and you took care of me. I was in prison and you visited me.'

"Then those who are righteous will reply to him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you a drink? When did we see you as a stranger and welcome you, or naked and give you clothes to wear? When did we see you sick or in prison and visit you?'

"Then the king will reply to them, 'I assure you that when you have done it for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you have done it for me.'

"Then he will say to those on his left, 'Get away from me, you who will receive terrible things. Go into the unending fire that has been prepared for the devil and his angels. I was hungry and you didn't give me food to eat. I was thirsty and you didn't give me anything to drink. I was a stranger and you didn't welcome me. I was naked and you didn't give me clothes to wear. I was sick and in prison, and you didn't visit me.'

"Then they will reply, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison and didn't do anything to help you?' Then he will answer, 'I assure you that when you haven't done it for one of the least of these, you haven't done it for me.' And they will go away into eternal punishment. But the righteous ones will go into eternal life."
