## Gathering in God's name

We meet in God's name, as God's people – children of God in all our rich diversity, with all that we carry from the complexity of our lives.

We turn to God in praise and prayer; this includes recalling all that has separated us from God, and claiming the love and forgiveness that is always held out to us.

The Collect then 'collects' these prayers and turns our attention towards the Bible readings which will follow.

## **Opening the Scriptures**

#### FIRST READING:

A reading from the book of Exodus (3.1-15)

Moses was keeping the flock of his father-in-law Jethro, the priest of Midian; he led his flock beyond the wilderness, and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the LORD appeared to him in a flame of fire out of a bush; he looked, and the bush was blazing, yet it was not consumed. Then Moses said, 'I must turn aside and look at this great sight, and see why the bush is not burned up.' When the LORD saw that he had turned aside to see, God called to him out of the bush, 'Moses, Moses!' And he said, 'Here I am.' Then he said, 'Come no closer! Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground.' He said further, 'I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob.' And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look at God. Then the LORD said, 'I have observed the misery of my people who are in Egypt; I have heard their cry on account of their taskmasters. Indeed, I know their sufferings, and I have come down to deliver them from the Egyptians, and to bring them up out of that land to a good and broad land, a land flowing with milk and honey, to the country of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites. The cry of the Israelites has now come to me; I have also seen how the Egyptians oppress them. So come, I will send you to Pharaoh to bring my people, the Israelites, out of Egypt.' But Moses said to God, 'Who am I that I should go to Pharaoh, and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?' He said, 'I will be with you; and this shall be the sign for you that it is I who sent you: when you have brought the people out of Egypt, you shall worship God on this mountain.' But Moses said to God, 'If I come to the Israelites and say to them, "The God of your ancestors has sent me to you", and they ask me, "What is his name?" what shall I say to them?' God said to Moses, 'I am who I am .' He said further, 'Thus you shall say to the Israelites, "I am has sent me to you." 'God also said to Moses, 'Thus you shall say to the Israelites, "The LORD, the God of your ancestors, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you": This is my name for ever, and this my title for all generations.

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans (12.9-21)

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so fr as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. #### NICENE CREED

## A Message from Rev'd Dave Thompson

God is awesome.

This week's readings include a favourite from Exodus with the account of the 'burning bush'...and the complexity of Paul continuing his lectures of Faithful morality in Romans and Jesus stunning remarks to get Peter to realise that whilst Jesus is certainly the Messiah, the journey may not be glory in the way Peter expects....the suffering servant imagery is a journey too far for Peter to grasp at this point. Worse, and what is subtly being intimated is that what's true for the Messiah is also true for the Messiah's disciples! Indeed this was what the early church was already experiencing. This is simply a bridge too far for Peter...too realistic and demanding to be taken seriously! Peter has the idea that there has to be another way to gain new life where, surely, one does not have to sacrifice their life; a way where Easter can be celebrated rather than facing Good Friday ... an avenue to messiahship other than through suffering and death! The miracle in Exodus is not the burning bush that does not get consumed...it is that the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob is speaking directly to Moses and is responding to the suffering of His people. And Moses is terrified at what he is being asked of him...like Peter with Jesus....there has to be another way.....God has heard the people cry and God has enlisted Moses to respond....one in terms of releasing the captives from the Brickworks of slavery: "you will go to Pharoah and tell him that the great I Am orders His people to be freed!" Moses would be thinking: "you want me to go where...to see who?... and say what?".....the other to rescue all of humanity from the bondage of failure loss....sin. "For God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten son..." God acts in the most improbable ways with the least expected people for his purposes of rescue. Regards Dave T
