FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles (10.44-48)

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, 'Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?' So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

SECOND READING

A reading from the first letter of John (5.1-12)

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth. There are three that testify: the Spirit and the water and the blood, and these three agree. If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.

THE GOSPEL

A great prophet has appeared among us; God has visited his people. Alleluia.

A reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John (15.9-17) Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. 'This is my commandment, that

you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I



appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.



# Planned Giving Program 2024/2025

You should have received your invitation to Stewardship Sunday and relative information by now - if you have been missed pick up a letter today or phone Pat Baines on 9315 7838.

**Stewardship Sunday will be held on 12th May.** All our services will be held at their normal times. This is an important day for the parish and all parishioners are invited to play their part in the new program. When we "plan our giving" the parish council is in a much better position to make responsible financial decisions such as the affordability of stipends, outreach programs and maintenance projects to name a few.

Giving can be made in several ways – by making a pledge (which can be adjusted at any time) or using weekly envelopes. It is also possible to use a set of envelopes without committing to a set sum, or to give using the open plate. Whichever method is chosen, parishioners can be assured that all matters relating to their giving remain confidential and can be varied at any time. Any questions regarding planned giving can be discussed with Pat Baines. The program lasts for 1 year and Pat and Anita have to have the new envelopes ready for distribution by the last Sunday in May (26th).
